Cessation of Requirement for ICA's Physical Endorsement on Cargo Clearance Permits (CCP)

Currently, for vehicles exported as non-containerised cargo, LTA requires the CCP to be endorsed by the Immigration & Checkpoints Authority (ICA) before it may be accepted as valid proof of vehicle export.

- In line with Singapore Custom's announcement that ICA officers at the cargo checkpoints will cease to manually endorse CCPs presented for clearance at the checkpoints, LTA will no longer require ICA's endorsement on the CCP for vehicles exported as non-containerised cargo, if the vehicle is shipped on board on or after 1 February 2022.
- We would like to take this opportunity to remind you on the required documents to be submitted for export of deregistered vehicles:

For vehicles exported via ocean freight

- Cargo Clearance Permit (CCP)¹
- Endorsed non-negotiable copy of Bill of Lading (BL)² issued by a shipping line, shipping company or freight agent containing the following details:
 - Exporter/Importer details
 - Vessel/Voyage number
 - Port of discharge/destination
 - Container/seal number (for vehicles exported in a container)
 - Engine and chassis numbers of vehicle exported
 - Date vehicle is shipped on board the vessel

¹ For non-containerised export which are shipped on board <u>before 1 February 2022</u>, LTA will not accept a CCP that has not been physically endorsed by ICA.

² The Bill of Lading has to be signed by its originating shipping line, shipping company, freight agent or master. A named agent, on behalf of the shipping line, shipping company or master, can also sign the Bill of Lading.

For vehicles exported by land

- Cargo Clearance Permit (CCP)¹
- Duly endorsed Malaysian Customs' Import Declaration Form³ containing the following details:
 - Exporter/Importer details
 - Engine and chassis numbers of vehicle exported
 - Date vehicle is exported
