## FIXED EVOLUTION COEFFICIENT FOR CO<sub>2</sub> EMISSION VALUES TESTED TO WORLDWIDE HARMONISED LIGHT VEHICLES TEST PROCEDURE ("WLTP")

- 1. As jointly announced by the National Environment Agency (NEA) and the Land Transport Authority (LTA) dated 2 April 2021, Singapore will adopt the WLTP<sup>1</sup> as the sole test procedure for Light Commercial Vehicles (LCVs)<sup>2</sup> from 1 April 2023, and passenger cars/taxis from 1 January 2024. LTA will thus discontinue the use of Fixed Evolution Coefficient (EC) of 0.92 for CO<sub>2</sub> emission values (tested to UNECE Regulation 101) for parallel-imported LCVs and passenger cars accordingly from these dates.
- 2. As WLTP Europe regulation provides an EC of 0.98 for CO<sub>2</sub> emission values, LTA will continue to allow the use of the Fixed EC of 0.98 only for WLTP Europe's CO<sub>2</sub> emission values of parallel-imported LCVs and passenger cars<sup>3</sup>. The conditions and requirements for the Fixed EC of 0.98 would be similar to what have been put in place for the use of Fixed EC of 0.92<sup>4</sup>.

- 3. With the adoption of WLTP, parallel importers can use CO<sub>2</sub> emissions test reports issued by overseas vehicle emissions testing laboratories<sup>5</sup> that are accredited to perform emission tests in accordance with WLTP<sup>6</sup> for batch approval applications in VITAS. However, please note that an overseas emission test report can only be used for subsequent batch approval applications for identical vehicles (i.e. same specs/class code) by the individual or company who owns the report.
